In Washington,

the National Japanese American Memorial Foundation hosts a panel discussion on the Japanese American experience during World War II. The event is co-sponsored by the Asian Pacific American Program, and commemorates the anniversary of the signing of Executive Order 9066 by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1942, which led to the imprisonment of 120,000 Americans of Japanese ancestry. Speakers for the panel include three writers who have written about the Japanese American experience during the war: Shirley Castelnovo, David Mura and Kiyo Sato. 6:30 p.m., Rasmuson Theater at the Smithsonian, 4th St. and Independence.
